

Here We Are, God. Use us.

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I. Send me!' Isaiah 6:8

Just as the prophet Isaiah heard and responded to God's call, we too hear God's voice asking, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go?" Sometimes we think we have nothing to offer. We think, "what use am I to God?" Yet, as we have been pondering questions to help identify our purpose, we discover that God equips and uses each one of us to build God's kingdom. Each is loved. Each is valuable. Each is redeemable. We need courage to respond, "Here I am. I give you my true self—my heart, mind, body, and soul, including my faults."

The disciples did not think that their measly five loaves of bread and two fish could be of use in feeding thousands. So they wanted to send the crowd away. But when they gave what they had to Jesus, no matter how little compared to the felt need, he was able to bless it and send the disciples out to feed the hungry crowds. So, too, when we offer our own gifts to God with trust, expectation, and readiness to meet the needs of others, they will be blessed and multiplied.

At our "State of Asbury" meeting on January 28th, we identified a snapshot of who we are at this moment as a church family—strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and challenges. In effect, we are saying "Here we are, God. This is us. Melt us, mold us, fill us, use us. Use even us."

We offer to God what we have and who we are, knowing and trusting that, in God's hands, it will be more than enough.

May our hearts be open and ready to serve God's purposes.



Thanks to someone who left this book in the church library: <u>Unshakable Hope; Building Our Lives on the</u> <u>Promises of God</u>, by Max Lucado. Max Lucado uses a number of the Bible's significant promises and shows how they help overcome difficult life problems. Lucado uses unusual comparisons, such as the pride—and fall--of Bernie Madoff and King Nebuchadnezzar, and humor such as jokingly "flaunting" that

he was Max at Office Max and being told, "Sir, you've got the name, but you don't have the clout."

He also used anecdotes about notable people from sports figures to martyrs of the Nazis. Each chapter includes a promise, such as "When a believing person prays, great things happen. James 5:16." Following the fourteen chapters, there are Questions for Reflection, suitable for small group studies or personal contemplation.
